

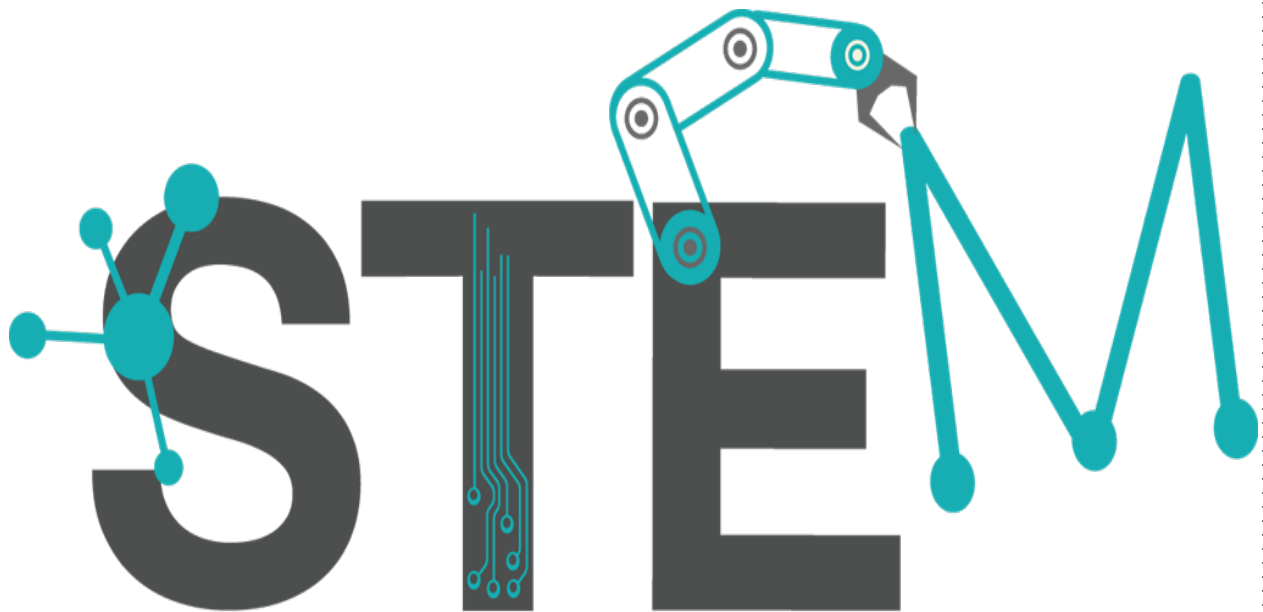

GENERAL INFORMATION

- **Beginning Coding** is a general enrichment opportunity provided through the D102 Talent Development Program. The primary goal of this program is to encourage children to pursue education in Computer Science fields as their education extends beyond to high school and college. The student created **Bit to Byte** is an organization comprised of LT students who have pursued these fields throughout their LT careers and will continue to do so in college. They will use MIT's "Scratch" program to teach elementary aged kids the basics of the program so that they may continue to create their own games on their own.

- Beginning Coding is open to all Scratch programmers in grades 3rd-5th! **We specifically recommend this program to first time "Scratchers"!** Given the nature of the classes and the students served, a very high level of behavioral standards is optimal for the benefit of everyone.
- This session will run three Monday evenings – February 26th, March 5th, and March 12th from 6PM – 7:30PM, at Park Junior High School (333 N. Park Rd, La Grange Park.) **The cost is \$35.** Students may bring a snack to class. **PLEASE do not bring peanuts.**
- Registration forms and information are found on PushCoin. Registrations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. If the class is full, PushCoin will not allow you to select the class. Classes are open to students within AND outside of District 102. Notification of classes that are canceled due to low enrollment will be made via an email.
